

District Priorities and Purpose

Athens ISD's **Plan for Use of Funds** for the ESSER III grant was developed with input from district stakeholders, as outlined in the Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services (RIPICS) Plan. This Use of Funds Plan has also been integrated into the overall **Comprehensive Needs Assessment** (CNA) process used by the district in the development of the **2021-2022 District Improvement Plan** (DIP), which is a continuation of the work from previous years.

The CNA includes input from several groups, including the District Site-Based Decision-Making Committee along with guidance from the Athens ISD Superintendent and Board of Trustees. While the Comprehensive Needs Assessment is an ongoing process, the goals, objectives, and strategies have been updated to reflect recent progress, as well as targeting new needs as they arise. The purpose is to provide a clear vision, leadership, and guidance to support all campuses in Athens ISD in providing an excellent education for all students.

The Use of Funds Plan will be reviewed every six months, as also outlined in the RIPICS Plan. With input from all stakeholders, the plan will be monitored, reviewed, revised as needed, and evaluated for effectiveness. The Use of Funds Plan is available as a hard copy at the District Administration Building, and electronically on the district homepage. The plan is in English and made available in Spanish upon request.

Meaningful Consultation

Stakeholder Input will be obtained and used to update the RIPICS and Use of Funds plans for ARP ESSER III, through the end of the grant project period.

Stakeholders include:

- Students, families, school and district administrators (including special education administrators); and teachers, principals, school leaders, other educators, school staff;
- to the extent present in or served by the LEA tribes, civil rights organizations (including disability rights organizations);
- stakeholders representing the interests of children with disabilities, English language learners, children experiencing homelessness, children in foster care, migrant students, children who are incarcerated, and other underserved students.

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

Universal and correct wearing of masks	Students & staff have the <u>option</u> to wear a mask or face shield. Face Coverings – Masks and face coverings are optional for students, staff, and visitors in district facilities, school buses, and school events. We would encourage students & staff to take whatever precautions they feel comfortable with considering COVID. As of June 5, 2021, per GA-36, school systems cannot require students or staff to wear masks.

Handwashing and Respiratory Etiquette	 Handwashing & Sanitizer Schools will have hand sanitizer in classrooms, in the cafeteria, and in common areas throughout the campus. Students & staff will utilize hand washing areas & sanitizer during the day. Students will be reminded to wash their hands on a regular basis. Staff will have access to disinfectant to sanitize high-touch surfaces and shared objects as needed. Respiratory Etiquette Students, teachers, staff, and campus visitors will be encouraged to cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue, and, if that is not possible, to cough or sneeze into the crook of the elbow. Used tissues should be thrown in the trash. Hands should be washed immediately with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, or hand sanitizer should be used.
Cleaning and Maintaining Healthy Facilities	Cleaning Athens ISD will continue to clean classrooms, restrooms, and other common areas daily. Deep Cleaning and Disinfection Protocol Deep cleaning is triggered when an active employee or student is identified as positive for COVID-19 based on testing. Deep cleaning will be performed as soon as the confirmation of a positive test, as practical. While the scope of deep cleaning is presumed to be the full site, sites may reduce the footprint to be deep cleaned if there is sufficient rationale to do so. We will close off areas that were heavily used by the individual with the test-confirmed case (student, teacher, or staff) until the non-porous surfaces in those areas can be disinfected, unless more than 24 hours

Contact Tracing & COVID Positive Test	Notification: Should Athens ISD have a large number of COVID cases, numbers will be posted on the website. Isolation and Quarantine for Positive Test-Confirmed Covid 19: Students who have test confirmed COVID-19 must meet the following: 24-hour period free of fever without medication; Symptoms have significantly improved;(coughing/breathing/shortness of breath); At least 5 days have passed since symptoms first occurred. Staff who have test confirmed COVID-19 must meet the following: 24-hour period free of fever without medication; Symptoms have significantly improved;(coughing/breathing/shortness of breath); At least 5 days have passed since symptoms first occurred or tested
	Staff and students are encouraged to wear masks for 5 days upon return of a positive test. If you have symptoms that could be COVID-19 it is advised that you seek medical advice and/or participate in district testing. Campus nurses will analyze each case and make decisions on when it is best for students/staff to return to school.
Diagnostic and Screening Testing	All staff should pre-screen for COVID-19 symptoms every day prior to entering the school. Parents must ensure they will not send a child to school on campus (or on a bus) if the child has COVID-19 symptoms or is test-confirmed with COVID-19. Symptomatic students will be referred to the nurse. COVID-19 testing will be offered to staff and students.

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Continuity of Services	To ensure the continuity of educational services, support will be provided to all students across the district. Consistent targeted instruction, as well as aligned interventions, will be provided. The following methods of instruction could be used for students with a lab-confirmed positive diagnosis of COVID-19 or a confirmed exposure: Teachers may use: Google Classroom, Canvas, and other resources for students. The campus principal and/or teachers will communicate information on continuity of services as needed. The school will provide technology as needed, for the student to complete schoolwork if needed.

If needed, the student will stay in isolation until picked up at the earliest possible time; If a district nurse has concerns that symptoms could indicate COVID-19, a parent will be required to submit a medical professional's note for return clearance. District COVID-19 testing will be provided upon request; Contact tracing (isolation/quarantine) could be required, the district will use CDC and health department guidelines as a consideration in determining isolation/quarantine. The district will report confirmed cases to the local health department.
Food Service	Athens ISD participates in the Community Eligibility Program and provides free breakfast and lunch to all students. Athens ISD provided breakfast and lunch for pick-up during school closure due to COVID.
